What is MAKER DAY? MAKER DAY is a fun, family-friendly, one-day festival that celebrates the inquisitive spirit in all of us as we learn, invent, craft, make, play, and celebrate the arts, crafts, engineering, science, and technology.

When is MAKER DAY? Saturday, June 4, 2016 from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. (set-up 11 a.m. – 1 p.m.)

Where is MAKER DAY? There will be exhibits at the Carnegie Museum of Montgomery County (inside) and the General Lew Wallace Study & Museum (outside).

Who can be an exhibitor? Anyone who makes anything – carpenters, blacksmiths, electricians, engineers, inventors, artists, crafters, garage tinkerers. Makers of all ages are welcome to participate.

How much does it cost? This event is FREE for the public to attend and FREE for exhibitors to participate

- As an exhibitor, you will demonstrate what you make and/or how it works, in an interactive environment. If there is a safe way to allow participants to try their hand at making or using something, that is encouraged.
- The Carnegie Museum of Montgomery County will host most of the electronic, science, and smaller exhibits as well as anything that must be inside. The General Lew Wallace Study & Museum will host most of the arts, crafts, and larger exhibits as well as those that must be outside (contain fire, etc.).
- Feel free to bring a pop-up tent for your exhibit space if you are at the Study. We will have a limited number of tables and chairs for your use during the event. Please indicate on the application how many you need.
- If you need electricity, please let us know. Please bring your own extension cords, power strips and/or surge protectors for your exhibit.
- If you sell items that you make, you are welcome to sell them at your booth. You are responsible for all money and transactions.
