

FOR PARENTS: ARCHICAMP



ArchiCamp is a program that directly fulfills the mission of the General Lew Wallace Study & Museum. Through two days of activities, walking tours, and hands-on activities, students will gain an appreciation of Crawfordsville's unique architectural heritage. The program is designed for students ages 8-12. Following is a tentative schedule and is subject to change as details are finalized.

TUESDAY, JUNE 18

During the first day of camp, students will learn the basics of architecture, including terms and techniques. Next, they will get a behind the scenes tour of the Study building and focus on its foundation, structure, tower, and brickwork. While on this tour, students will do a scavenger for architecturally relevant aspects of the building. After lunch, students will build and paint birdhouses to take home

WEDNESDAY, JUNE 19

The second day of camp will focus on skyscrapers. Campers will learn how skyscrapers are built to withstand high wind and earthquakes. Students will then take a walking tour of historic downtown Crawfordsville to discuss historic preservation of the city's largest structures, including the Ben-Hur Building, the Courthouse, the Elston Bank building, and the Crawford Fountain. After the walking tour will be lunch. In the afternoon, campers will then be split into groups to design and build a tower using limited resources.

PICK-UP AND DROP-OFF:

General Lew Wallace Study & Museum, 200 Wallace Avenue. Please park in the lot off Elston Avenue for pickup and drop off. Participants are expected to attend both sessions of ArchiCamp. Your family is expected to provide transportation to and from the Museum.

CLOTHING:

We will spend several hours outside each day, weather permitting, so please bring sunscreen, sunglasses, a hat, and sweatshirt or coat, depending on the weather.

FOOD:

A light morning and afternoon snack will be provided. Please let us know if you have any food allergies.

Participants should bring a sack lunch each day.

COST AND SPONSORSHIP:

Your child's participation in ArchiCamp has been sponsored by a local community service organization or a local business or individual. You may be contacted by that group and your child requested to give a short presentation at a meeting later in the summer, or during the fall.
